Demand Letter

Demand Letter

- 1. Everything starts with a demand letter
- 2. Purpose resolve dispute before litigation
- 3. No magic words
- 4. Include a deadline for compliance (ex: pay \$ within 10 days)





Federal Court versus State Court

Federal Court

- Established by the US Constitution
- Generally only 2 types of cases:
 - 1. Cases involving violations of the US Constitution or Federal law; or
 - 2. Cases between citizens of different states if the amount in controversy exceeds \$75k

State Court

- Established by state legislature
- Broad jurisdiction breach of contract, family disputes, traffic violations
- Not allowed to hear: lawsuits against the United States and those involving federal laws bankruptcy, antitrust, patents, copyrights, etc.

Who is the Defendant? (who am I filing the lawsuit against)

- Individual, Corp., LLC, LP
- Review credit application/contract
- Review invoices
- Do I have a personal guaranty?

<u>Venue</u> – where the lawsuit is filed

- Must decide where the lawsuit will be filed
- Ex: Dallas versus Houston
- General rule is venue lies where the defendant is located, but parties can decide in a contract where the venue for any lawsuit will take place.



ATTORNEYS AND COUNSELORS AT LAW

What is the lawsuit about?

- Basis for the lawsuit ex: breach of contract or unpaid invoices
- Remedies what are you asking the court to award?
 - 1. Damages Payment of Damages (ex: unpaid invoices)
 - 2. Nonmonetary Remedy (ex: injunction)

<u>Service</u>

- Must serve the Defendant with the lawsuit (if not, then court does not obtain jurisdiction and cannot rule in your favor)
- Methods: personal service, mail, publication
- Most states do not allow service through email
- Service the Defendant can take time if you don't have a good address or if the Defendant is dodging service.

Discovery

Discovery

- Once an answer has been filed, discovery starts.
- Discovery Fact finding phase of the case
- Usually lasts around 9 months (but could be longer)
- Can be expensive ex: electronic discovery or voluminous document review

Methods of Discovery

- 1 Interrogatories (written questions)
- 2. Request for Admissions
- 3. Request for Production of Documents
- 4. Depositions
- 5. Subpoenas (use with third parties)





Disposition Before Trial

Disposition Before Trial

Default Judgment and Summary Judgment

Default Judgment (no answer is filed)

- Defendant fails to file an answer
- Motion for Default Judgment
- Defendant admits everything is the lawsuit
- You win!

Disposition Before Trial

<u>Summary Judgment</u> (an answer has been filed)

- Motion for Summary Judgment
- No genuine issue of material fact
- Asking the court to rule in your favor without going to trial
- High burden









Bench Trial versus Jury Trial

Bench Trial

- Judge is the decider
- Usually moves along faster
- Less expensive
- Generally creditors prefer bench trials

Trial

Jury Trial

- Jury is the decider (usually 6 or 12 people)
- Takes longer (jury selection, jury charge, deliberations)
- Usually more expensive

Trial

Judgment

- Awarded if you win
- Will specify what relief you have been granted
- Damages amount of money
- Nonmonetary Damages, if any (ex: injunction)
- Unfortunately, does not guaranty payment. Once a judgment is obtained you still need to collect it.
